Betty and I recently spent some quality time with family in the Beartooth Mountains near Red Lodge Montana and Yellowstone National Park – “God’s Country”. As we were driving through this very scenic and serene part of our great nation, I was reminded how the shapes of the mountains and jagged peaks changed as the vantage point varied on our route. The mountains and peaks, of course, were still the same splendid mass of beauty, but their appearance changed along with our point of reference. Also, on one of our journeys, smoke from a nearby forest fire changed the appearance of the majestic peaks compared with what we observed a couple days earlier from the same vantage points.

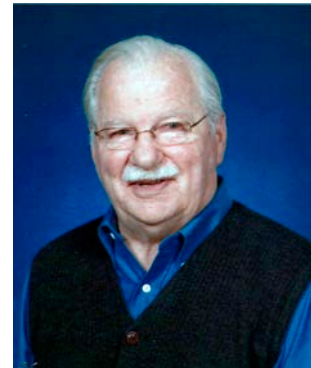
More people means less time picking up the road. For those who want to grab a bite to eat beforehand, we'll meet at the Legion at 8 am.

Jim was born to Charles and Henrietta (Wealing) Eshleman on August 6, 1927, in Adrian, MN, where he was raised and received his education. On July 5th, 1947 he married Marilyn Swenson, in Jasper, MN. Following their marriage his work took them to Sioux Falls and Huron, SD, Newton, IL, Mora and Hopkins.

In 1952, they moved to North Branch. Jim was employed as a heavy equipment operator and over the road truck driver.

In 1964, the family moved to Shakopee, where Jim became a Terminal Manager for Nitehawk Express. After retiring from Nitehawk Express, he drove semi for several other trucking companies.

Jim was a proud member of Minnesota River Valley Lodge #6 and Zuhrah Shrine Temple of Minneapolis.

He was made an Entered Apprentice on January 27, 1953, advanced to a Fellowcraft on February 24, 1953 and raised to a Master Mason on March 24, 1953.

Richard "Dick" Navratil, 83, of Pine Island, passed away unexpectedly at his residence on Wednesday, May 18, 2016.

A funeral service was held on Wednesday, May 25, 2016, at Saint Paul Lutheran Church in Pine Island, with the Rev. Darby Lawrence officiating.

Richard Charles Navratil was born on March 17, 1933, in Alexandria, Minn. His adoptive parents, John and Margaret Navratil, raised him and his stepbrothers in the Alexandria area.

Dick graduated from Alexandria High School in 1951. After high school, he joined the United States Army in 1951. Dick served as a sergeant during the Korean conflict. Following his honorable discharge in 1954, he returned to Alexandria and worked for the Area Dock Resorts. He soon met Jan Thorson, and they were married on July 5, 1958, after she had finished teaching school, and he had finished engineering school for IBM in New York.

Dick bought into Pine Plating in 1965. He started working for IBM in Rochester in 1970 and sold his interest in Pine Plating in 1985. Dick remained in the Pine Island area, where he was a volunteer firefighter for 26 years and a member of the Pine Island American Legion, Stary Yerka VFW Post 5727 in Zumbrota and the Osman Shrine in Rochester. 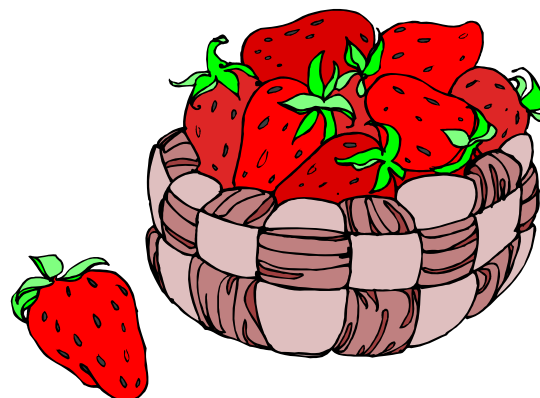
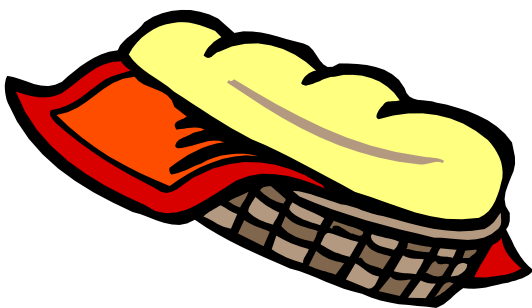

## Kids ID Program



Last winter, SW Chris, his wife Terry, SD Reed and I attended a meeting conducted by MWB Cook regarding the KidsID Program. We were quite moved regarding the number of children that are lost and abducted in the United States every year:

Nearly 800,000 children are reported missing. Although the vast majority return home safely, too many never return about one child in 10,000 reported missing is murdered. You are doubtless familiar with the tragedy experienced in August of a 5-year-old girl abducted and murdered in Watkins, MN.

I urge that you visit this video developed by The Grand Lodge of Minnesota:

At any given time nearly 84,000 individuals are reported as missing in the US. We want to present to Lebanon Lodge the idea of sponsoring and organizing a KidsID event. If met with the approval of the Lodge to move forward with this initiative, we will reach out to MV6, Eastern Star, Job's Daughters, and DeMolay.

But we will need volunteers that will be willing and able to donate a minimum of three days: one day to attend a train-the-trainer session, one day to organize and train volunteers, and one day to actually work the event. We would also be soliciting additional volunteers to help develop a marketing campaign and solicit local businesses to help sponsor the event.

Cost to the Lodge is \$4.00 per child processed. Please give consideration to this initiative and let's discuss at an upcoming Stated Meeting.
