Masons in the Dark

As Master you come across many things in your duties for your Lodge. Bylaws, social events, supporting your appendant bodies (Job's Daughters, OES and other Lodges), fund raising events and even funerals for your Brothers. You also spend time with newest Brothers in the North-East. All the while, you're trying to be a role model.

One thing that many people know about me is that I am so proud to be a Mason and wear my ring proudly. It's not something that I wear to show off. Quite the contrary. I wear it, that other Masons may know me in the Light as well as the dark.

But what about the Masons that wear nothing? Not like wearing a ring or a shirt, but never wear anything so no one knows. I'm not speaking about the man that doesn't wear anything because he wears a uniform or can't wear rings, etc. I'm speaking about the man that doesn't want to be recognized as a Mason at all.

In the Light as well as the dark. We have something that when we are in dire straits or need we can use to call to our other Brothers to let them know we ARE a Brother in need. But why would one ever hide that intentionally? I've had a discussion with a Brother recently about this and how we both agree that if you're intentionally hiding this, you're no better than a clandestine Mason.

Think about it. You're hiding who you are. Hiding who you've obligated yourself to be to your Brothers.

I've recently heard how a man just became a Mason and then a ton of cousins and uncles have come up to him and told him they're Masons as well. Why did you hide it prior? What was the point of hiding this? Why are you not proud to show this? My nephews know that I'm a Mason. Everyone in my family knows that I'm a Mason. The People that I work with know I'm a Mason. I know that we're all different. Heck, that's what Masonry is. Acceptance. Acceptance of different things, thoughts and beliefs.

When you hide, you're being clandestine. Clandestine – Kept secret or done secretly. When you intentionally hide you're a Mason, you're clandestine. Our Grand Lodge bylaws even address this; we are not allowed to converse Masonically, "And that no countenance be given to any irregular Lodge or to any person clandestinely initiated therein, being contrary to the Ancient Charges of Freemasonry."

Now I know what you're saying. If a Mason chooses to hide that he's a Mason, that doesn't necessarily apply to that above statement. You're absolutely right. So, let me ask you something.

Why would you want to, Masonically, associate with someone with a "Brother" that doesn't want to be recognized as such? Why are you reading this newsletter? I'm guessing to catch up with the Lodge's comings and goings. To see what upcoming events you'd like to attend. To gain further Light?

That's exactly I'm doing every time I meet with you Brother. I'm catching up with you. I'm giving and accepting of your feelings, love, thoughts and ideas. I'm Gaining further Light from you. Because you identify yourself as a Brother Mason to me.

Brothers I ask that you let your Masonic Light shine to all, Masonic and non-Masonic. How else are other men, deserving of such a wonderful gift, supposed to ask us questions if they don't even know we exist?

Never look down on someone unless you're helping them up. I am, and always will be, my Brother's keeper.


